

## School Improvement Plan | 2017-18

For the 2017-18 school year, our community at Cityview Community is dedicated to working together toward our school-wide goals, focused on increasing the academic achievement of all students and ensuring that our school is a great place for all learners.

### This year we are striving to achieve the following goals:

- Goal 1:** In math, the percent of students who earn an achievement level of Meets or Exceeds the standards on the Math MCA at Cityview will increase from 9% in 2017 to 17% in 2018.
- Goal 2:** In literacy, the percent of students who earn an achievement level of Meets or Exceeds the standards on the Reading MCA at Cityview will increase from 13% in 2017 to 21% in 2018.
- Goal 3:** In the area of engagement, the percentage of students in the A and B attendance levels will increase from 47% in 2017 to 55% in 2018.

### In order to reach these goals, we'll be using the following strategies:

<b>Differentiation through Guided Reading Groups</b>	We will use the Benchmark ELD scaffolds and Guided Reading Practice Profiles to support literacy instruction differentiation to meet the individual needs of each student. To further support student growth, we will provide all students in grades 2-5 with access to the Rock N Read program to support literacy achievement connected to music. Differentiation will also be supported through arts-based strategies including Tableaux and Visual Thinking Skills.
<b>Differentiation through Guided Math</b>	We will utilize and provide professional development and on-going support in math instruction through the use of the practice profile. This will lead to improved implementation of guided groups and differentiated instruction. Guided Math will also be supported through the Guided Math station resource, Dreambox Math.
<b>PSWE Toolkit</b>	The PSWE toolkit will be utilized through the ALT/PSWE team and classroom teachers/support staff to create classroom PSWE plans, to support social emotional learning, and positively engage students and families to increase attendance at school.
