

CELL PHONE AND PERSONAL ELECTRONIC POLICY



Cityview School will follow the personal electronic (cell phone) district policy and will accept no responsibility for loss or damage to personally owned devices brought to school by students. Students will leave electronic devices including cell phones at home, in locker, in pockets or with a teacher. We ask that families and students use the main office when communicating messages from home or school.

Students using cell phones or electronic devices without authorization or supervision will get their cell phones taken away and a parent or guardian will have to come to the school and claim the cell phone or electronic device back.



Thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue to make sure every student gets to school and home safely. **It is very important to discuss these school bus safety tips with your child.**

- *When waiting for the bus: Be patient, stand back from road, and no running or rowdy behavior.
- *When on the bus: Stay seated, listen to the driver, and use quiet voices.
- *When getting off the bus, look to be sure no cars are passing on the shoulder (side of the road).
- *Wait for the driver to signal that it's safe to cross.
- *Make sure that traffic has come to a complete stop before crossing the street.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!!!

Good attendance promotes academic success. It is very important for you to make sure your child is in school every school day. **Students are not to be dropped off before 8:00AM.** There is no one here to supervise them! If your child is absent, please call 612. 668. 2279. You may leave a message or send a note explaining the reason for the absence when your child returns to school.

School is in session 8:15AM– 2:30PM. Please send your child to school on time. Tardiness results in the loss of academic instruction for the student. There is a significant link between attendance and academic achievement. Students should be at school by 8:15AM. Our school day ends at 2:30PM and all students that do not take the bus home **MUST** be picked up by no later than 2:50PM.
