Home & School Connection: Working Together for School Success

A Small note from Principal Renee Montague

Want to spend time with your child, build their reading skills, and help them learn to love books? You can do all three when you read together with your child. Here are some helpful suggestions.



Read regularly. Try to read to your child every day. Aim for 15-30 minutes of bedtime reading for a peaceful end of the day routine.

Take turn choosing books. Your child may want to hear old favorites again and again. Use your turn for new titles and pick a variety of books.

Let your child participate. Ask your child to turn the pages while you read. Also, they can finish sentences that rhyme or fill in words that they know. They will enjoy read-aloud time more if they play an active role.

Be playful. You can use different voices for different characters. Substitute your child's name for one of the characters in the book.

You don't have to be an expert reader- your child will love it when you read together because it's you they're reading with!
